



Flights

Dove hunting occurs in the province of Córdoba, in Central Argentina. Córdoba Airport offers direct flights from Miami (USA), which departs on Saturdays and Sundays.

Córdoba is midway between Santiago de Chile and Buenos Aires, there are daily direct flights from many U.S. cities to Santiago, and to Buenos Aires with connecting flights to Córdoba City.

Be aware there is an international (Ezeiza International Airport) and a domestic (Aeroparque Jorge Newbery) airport in Buenos Aires located an hour drive away from each other. Try to avoid arriving at the international airport but taking a flight to Cordoba from the domestic one.



Weather

Pleasant weather with 320 days of sun per year. Average temperature in Winter is 60 F and average temperature in summer is 95 F. The area is dry, and even during rainy seasons, it never rains a whole day. Is rare to lose a hunt because of weather conditions.
